10. Pap Smear is:

- a simple test to detect cervical cancer
- some cervix cells are taken and studied under a microscope to detect abnormalities
- doctor examines other organs (ovaries, pelvic...)
- one might feel uncomfortable but the test is safe and takes only couple minutes

11. After taking the Pap Test:

- the doctor will send the cells sample to a lab technician for testing
- a few days later, if one doesn't receive the result, she should ask the doctor for it
- Do not assume that nobody telling you about your test means you are perfectly healthy.

12. Do you need to get a Pap Test?

- no, I am very healthy / no family records about the disease
- yes, so I can detect cervical cancer at an early stage
- no, it's too expensive / my insurance won't pay for it
- no, it's too painful

13. At what age does one need to get a Pap Test:

- 18 and over, even aged, in menopause, or hysterectomy
